News from the Parish Council

Mickfield Parish Council held an extraordinary meeting to discuss the Bio Mass incinerator at Mendlesham. The Council concurred that we would object due to many factors but particularly increase in traffic on minor roads, what happens when straw/wood chippings run out etc. It is now up to the District Council to decide.

Due to the other events due to take place on the Queens Diamond Jubilee, the Parish Council has decided not to go ahead with its planned celebrations on the Meadow. There are various events planned over that weekend and we felt it was not likely to be well supported.

Jubilee Garden and Quiet Area

The 'Bike Park' looks likely to be the subject of a 'makeover'! The thinking is that the area of meadow that is in the corner where the park currently is, should become a quiet reflective area with trees and seating. The area to the side of the gateway into the church prior to the entry to the Cemetery is currently overgrown with brambles etc. The hope is that this area may be transformed by the local children into a children's garden. This way should it become redundant, it will be easy to revert back to Meadow grassland.

We have been extremely fortunate to gain the services of Otley College horticultural staff and students to work on the Meadow. It is anticipated:

The 'Bike Park' will be flattened and levelled out. Native trees will be planted and some seats/benches placed for a quiet area. The planting will be such that the area can be mown with the rest of the field on a fortnightly basis. The area of ground in front of the Church, which is currently rough and overgrown, will be levelled and grassed so that this can also be mown. We are currently assessing the idea that Village children may want to create a garden area here. Your thoughts and ideas are welcome.
